#### **Scholarships**

The IAEM offers a <u>scholarship program</u> for eligible student members. The Scholarship Program was developed to nurture, promote, and develop disaster preparedness and resistance by furthering the education of students studying the field of emergency management, disaster management, or a related program. ## The Natural Hazards Research and Applications Workshop

Each year, the Natural Hazards Center at University of Colorado – Boulder, hosts the Natural Hazards Workshop in Broomfield Colorado.

The annual workshop brings together over 500 federal, state, and local mitigation and emergency management officials; representatives of nonprofit, private sector, and humanitarian organizations; hazards and disaster researchers; and others dedicated to alleviating the impacts of disasters. The workshop is a great way to meet landmark researchers in the emergency management field and stay up-to-date on current EM information.

Scholarship Opportunity: The Mary Fran Myers Scholarship provides financial assistance for individuals to attend the Natural Hazards Workshop in Boulder, Colorado in July (details are available <u>here</u>). This is an opportunity that brings practitioners and researchers to the Workshop for the first time. This year, applications will be accepted for people who reside outside North America and the Caribbean. Applications are being accepted through March 15.

## **FEMA Higher Education Symposium**



The 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Emergency Management Higher Education Symposium will be held June 3-6, 2019 in Emmittsburg, Maryland.

FEMA's Higher Education Program, within the National Training and Education Division's National Training and Education System, will coordinate workshops, plenaries, and breakout sessions highlighting how to build, engage, and amplify the work of the emergency management academic community while focusing on diversity, inclusion, and unity of effort.

The Higher Education Symposium is unique in the sense that you do not have to pay to attend, it includes room & board, and your only expenses are your own travel to the Baltimore area where a shuttle will transport you to and from the National Emergency Training Center (NETC), and a meal ticket that covers all meals for the duration of the symposium.

Additionally, there are student volunteer opportunities available that helps expand networking potential and opportunities to work alongside many EM professionals. As an attendee last year, it goes without saying that my experience was highly beneficial and opened the door for a lot opportunity to be involved and collaborate on projects within, and outside of, the Higher Education Program.
