ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Disclaimer: A student who is conditionally admitted must meet certain requirements. A student conditionally admitted must be continuously enrolled in prescribed developmental skills courses, participate in prescribed counseling and advisement activities, and remediate all academic skill deficiencies (including LS 104) within one year. HONORS PROGRAM

First year students earning a 25 or higher composite score on the ACT and have a B average in high school are invited to join the Honors Program. Honors classes are not designed to be harder than regular classes. Some of the benefits include: smaller class size, priority registration, service learning and community service opportunities, domestic and international travel opportunities, and special recognition at graduation. In order to graduate with honors a student must successfully complete 24 hours of honors credit. Students must be a member of the Honors Program to take Honors courses. FIRST-YEAR STUDENT COURSE REQUIREMENTS

STU 101

All students with fewer than 24 earned hours must take **STU 101 (First Year Experience):** Students will achieve course objectives related to their overall adjustment to being a successful student at JSU. Topics discussed include how to declare a major and develop a relationship with an academic advisor; understand components of MyJSU; know and understand JSU policies; participate in the common reading program; learn and become active in JSU activities for students; understand and develop appropriate behavior for a college student; become familiar with student services; and acquire knowledge and skills necessary to prosper as a JSU student.

LS 104

Conditionally Admitted students must take LS 104 (Academic Success Skills): This course will be completed during the first year of enrollment and is an individualized freshman seminar providing supportive guidance in study skills, problem solving, decision making, and college adjustment.

HOW DO I CHANGE MY MAJOR?



A NOTE FOR JSU FAMILIES AND GUESTS

Higher education represents a partnership involving the student. the student's family, and the university. We believe that parents and guardians should be aware of their student's experiences with the university. During orientation, the emphasis for students is on understanding the curriculum and registering for fall semester classes, in addition to identifying their responsibilities and opportunities for involvement in the university community. We invite you to participate in orientation as your student is taking his or her first steps at the university (a fee of \$20 per family member or guest will be charged).

By participating in orientation, you will become informed about university academic programs, policies, facilities, and services. Moreover, we hope you will begin to feel an affinity for the university as your student's involvement increases. Orientation, for parents as well as students, is an academic program. Because orientation is an academic program for students and parents alike, there is not an accompanying program for younger children.

DINING SERVICES

All university dining is managed by Sodexo Dining Services which provide a variety of flexible meal plans available for both resident and commuter students. If you live on campus in Crow, Curtis, Daugette, Dixon, Fitzpatrick, Logan, Patterson, Meehan Hall, or Sparkman, your JSU account will automatically be billed for the plan and you will need to choose from the options listed to the right. **If you do not choose a plan you will be placed on the default plan of eight meals per week with \$350 flex.** For more details on how the meal plan works, please visit the Sodexo website: **dining.jsu.edu**.

Flex can be used at any of the food locations listed on campus. Students will access their Flex "Dollars" using their JSU student ID. Students will swipe their ID and the amount they purchase will be deducted from their current total amount of Flex.



The same could be said about millions of first-year college students across the country each year, as they pack their bags and move away from everything they've ever known. Coping with stress, anxiety, depression, and even suicidal thoughts has become a dark reality on college campuses, and JSU is committed to bringing these important issues into the light. Therefore, we are pleased to announce Suicide Notes, by Michael Thomas Ford, as the 2018 Common Reading Program book.

FROM HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA:

Take US-Hwy 431 (Governor's Drive) South through Gadsden. Once south of Gadsden, turn left onto Alabama Hwy 204. Hwy 204 leads directly to campus. Please consult the campus map for your desired location.

FROM BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA:

Take I-20 East to Exit 185 (Anniston/Oxford-Alabama Hwy 21). Turn left onto Alabama Hwy 21 North. Go through Oxford, Anniston/McClellan, and the Jacksonville Square (about twenty miles). You will see the twelve story Houston Cole Library on the right and the marble university sign on the left. The entrance to the university is on your left. Please consult the campus map for your desired location.

FROM MONTGOMERY, ALABAMA:

Take US-Hwy 231 North. In Sylacauga, take Alabama Hwy 21 North off of US-Hwy 231. Go through Talladega, Oxford, Anniston/McClellan, and the Jacksonville Square (about thirty-seven miles). You will see the twelve story Houston Cole Library on the right and the marble university sign on the left. The entrance to the university is on your left. Please consult the campus map for your desired location.


FROM ATLANTA, GEORGIA:
