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
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On February 22, 2008, Jacksonville State University celebrated its 125th anniversary as a higher education institution dedicated to northeast Alabama and residents throughout the state, nation and global society. Initially named Jacksonville State Normal School, Governor Edward O'Neal signed into law a bill creating the school on February 22, 1883.

Served by eleven presidents throughout its history, Jacksonville State University now enrolls almost 10,000 students under the leadership of Dr. William A. Meehan, President since 1999. Dr. Meehan's vision for the University focuses on growth, quality academic programs, student access, technology, student support services and continuous improvement. Jacksonville State University has made much progress in supporting President Meehan's vision. This progress is a measure of our success.




## **University Vision Statement**

Jacksonville State University will be the regional comprehensive institution of choice for students who want a strong, high quality education. Students will be challenged academically by dedicated and accessible faculty and have access to the latest technology to develop skills for success in an expanding global community. Curricula offerings will utilize developing methods of instruction to eliminate barriers of time and distance and allow the JSU experience to transcend regional boundaries. Highly responsive services that demonstrate the institution's commitment to continuous improvement will ensure JSU's reputation as the friendliest campus in the South.

### Growth

During the past five years Jacksonville State University's student enrollment grew more than six percent. With the President's goal to increase enrollment to 10,000 by 2010, the University is meeting its benchmarks, enrolling 9,481 students in fall 2008.

In addition to the growth in student enrollment, the number of full-time faculty members also increased. Within the last five years the number of students increased 6%, while the number of fulltime faculty increased more than 7%.



Today, Jacksonville State University boasts 322 full-time faculty members. Faculty fulfill the President's vision by being responsible for challenging JSU students academically and by being accessible to students. The 2008 National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) indicated that JSU seniors are more likely to work with faculty members inside and outside the classroom than students at peer institutions nationally.

To support growth, a new Office of Marketing and Communications was established to implement marketing plans and advertising initiatives.

### **Quality Academic Programs**

Jacksonville State University's strategic plan states that it will accredit all academic programs that can be nationally accredited. In addition to regional accreditation through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), Jacksonville State now offers 38 programs with specialized national accreditation. The latest program to gain accreditation was the Department of Communication, by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communication (ACEJMC).

JSU freshmen were more likely than their peers at other universities to report that they worked harder than they thought they could to meet an instructor's standards or expectations.

JSU's College of Commerce and Business was recognized for three consecutive years by *The Princeton Review* as one of "The Best 237 Business Schools." This places the JSU College of Commerce and Business among the top 10% of all business schools in the United States.

JSU's College of Commerce and Business was ranked number two in the nation by *The Princeton Review* in the category of "Greatest Opportunities for Women."

The Master of Science in Computer Systems and Software Design (MSSD) program at JSU was ranked the number two "best buy" among sixty-seven online Masters programs in computer science and information technology offered by regionally accredited institutions in the USA. This honor was received only one year after offering the program entirely online.

In addition to high quality academic programs, Jacksonville State University faculty are among the most highly qualified in the nation. Highlighting only a few of the many faculty accomplishments:

- Dr. Guillermo Francia, Professor of Computer Science, was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to Malta in 2006-07.
- Dr. Nouredine Zettili, Professor of Physics, was a Fulbright Scholar in the United Arab Emirates in 2007-08.
- Dr. LaJoyce Debro was appointed for the second consecutive year as Program Director by the National Science Foundation. Dr. Debro



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
is on leave from Jacksonville State University and serves in the Biology Directorate in the Division of Molecular and Cellular Biosciences.

#### **Student Access**

The President's vision focuses on developing methods of instruction that eliminate barriers of time and distance. Since his inauguration on July 1, 1999, Dr. Meehan supported a focus on high quality distance education. Through the Internet, DVDs, and videoconferencing initiatives, the University is able to make a college education more accessible to those who work, or for other reasons are not able to reside on or near the main campus.

The number of students taking distance education courses more than doubled in the past five years, with 3,234 students taking distance education courses in fall 2008. Seventeen academic programs are currently offered completely online. These include:

- RN/BSN/MSN in Nursing (STEP Program)



The number one source of information about JSU for new students is the JSU Web site, followed by parents/relatives and campus visits.

JSU is also committed to putting student access first in scheduling summer terms and courses. A study of summer 2008 found that overall, JSU students felt their needs were met. Almost all respondents (92.5%) said they were able to register for the classes they wanted and more than 80% said they agreed or strongly agreed with the statement, *my overall summer experience at JSU has been good.* 

The results also found that of those who attended classes in summer 2008 most reported that they paid for classes out of their pockets or the pockets of family members, with 64% saying they would be able to take more classes in the summer if the University had a payment plan. As a result of the outcomes from this survey and recommendations from academic and administrative committees, President Meehan asked that:

- JSU maintain the number of summer terms provided in summer 2008.
- Academic departments identify spring 2008 and fall 2008 courses that were full and courses needed to graduate and schedule more of them during the summer.
- The Office of Distance Education continue to work with academic departments to develop high quality online courses and provide support to faculty creating these courses for the first time.
- JSU business and administrative offices work on providing a payment plan for students that would begin in summer 2009.



This example of using student feedback from surveys and other assessment measures illustrates just one of the ways that JSU listens to students' collective voices to put students first.



#### Technology

Technology continues to be a focus in support of student learning, research, information management and evidence-based decision-making. Within the past five years Jacksonville State University migrated to a new administrative system, Banner. The Luminis portal, MyJSU, was also installed providing web-based access to calendars, administrative data, and the University's new content management system for departmental Web sites, which improved the overall look and feel for JSU's web presence. Wireless hot spots were added across campus in the Houston Cole Library, administrative and academic buildings, and in the quad. In addition, a technology replacement fund was developed that ensures student labs are equipped with new computers and peripherals every three to four years.

#### **Student Support Services**

Jacksonville State University is committed to supporting success throughout students' academic careers. As a result, a new strategic enrollment management plan was developed that focuses on creating living and learning communities, expand-

ing the honors program and increasing retention and graduation rates. New four-year scholarships were made available to students and many new scholarships were established as a result of the University's capital campaign that raised more than \$20 million. A new student transportation system, 400-bed residence hall and expanded stadium project were approved by the Board of Trustees recently.



#### **Continuous Improvement**

For the purpose of supporting continuous improvement, Jacksonville State University's Program Review system was initiated in fall 2005. Providing seven 18-month cycles, every academic and administrative program will participate in self-study and on site peer review by 2012. With more than 27 programs completing Program Review thus far, the system clearly promotes meaningful assessment, benchmarking, collaboration, planning and implementation of new initiatives.

Over the past five years Jacksonville State University's decision-makers have been dedicated to wisely committing fiscal resources to educating students to be productive, responsible citizens and effective leaders through academic excellence, research and service, and a diverse learning community. The University's President provided leadership locally, regionally, and statewide, while guiding the University in accomplishing the statewide goals of access, cooperation, quality, resources, and workforce development.



JSU students agreed that the most important reasons to attend classes in the summer were to graduate (84.2%) and complete their degree faster (72.4%).

### The 2008 National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) Results

Jacksonville State University participated in the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) in spring 2008. Of the 1,670 freshmen and 1,248 seniors responding, 90% of the freshmen participants were traditional students, defined as less than 24 years of age, while 42% of seniors were considered traditional. Full-time students made up 93% of the freshmen participants and 75% of the seniors. The percentage of females (65% freshmen/68% seniors) completing the survey was higher than the total percentage of female students university-wide (60%).

Comparisons were computed with southeastern public four year schools, universities in JSU's carnegie classification, and with all NSSE 2008 participants. Mean comparisons suggested:

### JSU students (freshmen and seniors)

- were more likely to prepare two or more drafts of a paper or assignment before turning it in;
- were more likely to participate in activities to enhance their spirituality (worship, meditation, prayer, etc.);
- reported higher quality of relationships with administrative personnel and offices; and
- were more likely to spend more time working for pay off campus and were also more likely to spend more time caring for dependents living with them.

### **JSU** seniors

- were more likely to talk about career plans with a faculty member or advisor;
- were more likely to receive prompt written or oral feedback from faculty on academic performance;
- reported they were more likely to take exams that challenged them to do their best work;
- were more likely to examine their own strengths and weaknesses of their own views on a topic or issue;
- reported higher quality of relationships with other students and faculty members than their peers at other universities;
- responded more favorably that their experience at JSU contributed to acquiring job or workrelated knowledge and skills, writing clearly and effectively, speaking clearly and effectively, using computing and information technology, voting in local, state or national elections, and developing a deepened sense of spirituality; and
- reported a higher satisfaction with the quality of academic advising than their peers.

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### **JSU freshmen**

- were more likely to work harder than they thought they could to meet an instructor's standards or expectations;
- were more likely to memorize facts, ideas or methods from courses and readings; while they were less likely to analyze, synthesize and apply theories and concepts for their coursework as compared to their peers;
- reported they had more homework sets that took them less than an hour to complete than their peers;
- likely spent more time commuting to class; and
- responded more favorably than their peers that their experience at JSU contributed to their speaking clearly and effectively, voting in local, state or national elections and developing a deepened sense of spirituality.

## The 2007-2008 Graduating Senior Survey Results

Of the 581 graduating seniors responding to the 2007-2008 Graduating Senior Survey, 69% were female, 31% were male. Their average age was 26. Nearly all (91%) were enrolled fulltime. More than two-thirds (71%) were single. Forty-seven percent of the respondents were enrolled in the College of Education and Professional Studies, 29% in the College of Arts and Sciences, 15% in the College of Commerce and Business Administration, and 9% in the College of Nursing and Health Science. Nearly one-third (31%) of the participants in the survey planned to enroll in a graduate program.

When compared with the average person their age, a majority considered themselves above average or in the highest 10% in the following characteristics:

- Drive to achieve (81%)
- Cooperativeness (76%)
- Understanding of others (72%)
- Leadership ability (67%)
- Academic ability (65%)
- Self-confidence (intellectual) (65%)

### **Perceptions of their Major**

- Nearly all indicated the overall quality of their major was good or excellent (91%) and were satisfied or very satisfied with their overall education at JSU (85%).
- Computer (85%) and laboratory (76%) facilities and library holdings (93%) for major were adequate or more than adequate.
- One-half frequently applied concepts learned in their major to solve actual problems (50%), expressed ideas in writing (49%), and expressed ideas orally (47%).
- Three-quarters or more agreed or strongly agreed that:
  - grading procedures were fair (82%)
  - requirements were explained clearly (75%)
  - my advisor was willing to help (76%)
  - department faculty were professionally competent (80%) and effective teachers (80%)
  - at least one professor worked closely with me (76%)
  - faculty were approachable (84%) and accessible outside of class (76%)
  - fundamental theories were taught (88%)
  - current research methods were taught (80%)
  - courses were intellectually stimulating (80%)
  - sufficient practical training was provided (76%)

### **Educational Outcomes**

Respondents thought the following educational outcomes were important and that their JSU experiences prepared them well to perform them:

- Working cooperatively and as a team member (87%)
- Writing effectively (86%)
- Using computers to search for and retrieve information (86%)
- Listening effectively (85%)

- Working in an ethical manner (84%)
- Reading comprehension (84%)
- Defining and solving problems (83%)
- Making and exercising a lifelong commitment to learning (82%)
- Using and applying basic computer skills (81%)
- Thinking objectively about beliefs, attitudes, and values (81%)
- Making formal presentations (81%)
- Speaking effectively (80%)
- Analyzing, synthesizing, and evaluating information (80%)
- Having tolerance for different points of view (80%)
- Acting ethically (80%)
- Understanding the interaction of people and their environment (76%)

### Satisfaction with University facilities, services, and climate

- Nearly all graduating seniors were satisfied with class size (90%) and the testing/grading system (87%).
- Most were satisfied with the course content in their major (81%), availability of computers (77%), out-of-class availability of instructors (73%), attitude of non-teaching staff toward students (70%), personal security on campus (65%), and racial/ethnic harmony (64%).
- Respondents reported satisfaction with the services and facilities they used the most, including:
  - Houston Cole Library (86%)
  - Campus bookstore (60%)
  - Computer labs (78%)
  - Classroom facilities (81%)
  - Online courses through Distance Education (55%)
  - Bursar's Office, payments window (68%)
  - Laboratory facilities (62%)
  - Phone/Internet registration (64%)
  - Food services (60%)
  - Financial Aid (53%)
  - Academic advising services (51%)

### The 2007-2008 Graduate Student Exit Survey Results

Of the 657 graduate students responding to the 2007-2008 Graduate Student Exit Survey, 72% were female, 28% were male. Part-time students made up 60% of the respondents. Six percent were enrolled in Master of Arts programs, 21% in Master of Science programs, 3% in Master of Business Administration program, 9% in Master Public Administration program, 46% in Master of Science in Education programs, and 15% in Education Specialist programs. One-half (53%) earned their degree in two years or less.

Factors that impact students' decision to attend JSU the most:

- Availability of on-line courses (61%)
- JSU's convenient location (58%)
- Cost of attending JSU (56%)
- Reputation of their department (56%)
- Unique features of their degree program (55%)

### Perceptions of their degree program:

- Nearly all indicated the overall quality of their program was good or excellent (93%);
- Nearly all respondents who were graduate assistants (9%) reported that they had a positive experience as graduate assistant (97%)

Nearly all respondents indicated that their program:

- encouraged academic/professional interactions with other students (95%)
- adequately prepared them for career (93%)
- had adequate instructional supplies and equipment (90%)
- requirements were explained clearly (89%)
- had adequate classroom facilities (88%)
- Frequently had classes that required some form of research (78%);
- Faculty were highly competent instructionally (94%) and professionally (92%);
- Good quality of courses as preparation for employment after graduation (87%); and
- Good curricular advising (76%)

When asked to reflect on the courses they took toward their degree, nearly all indicated that:

- Courses provided an understanding of the major theories (96%), research methodology (95%), accepted professional practices (95%), necessary knowledge (94%), and necessary bibliographical skills (93%) in respondents' disciplines
- Faculty provided clear understanding of evaluation methods used in each class (95%) and of the class goals and requirements (95%), and allowed students a reasonable degree of freedom-independence in the way assignments were conducted (93%)
- The sequencing of courses was appropriate (92%)
- The evaluation methods, and grades awarded, properly differentiated levels of student performance (92%)

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### Perceptions of the University services:

- Graduate Studies Office provided good advisement (85%), clear and helpful information (84%) on admissions (94%) and graduation application procedures (83%), and had personnel who were courteous (90%) and prompt in responding to requests (86%).
- Houston Cole Library provided adequate library access for off-campus students (83%), personnel to meet the needs (76%), services (75%), book and periodical collections (74%), and operating hours (70%).
- Computer facilities/services provided adequate computer lab services (66%), academic computer software (66%) and hardware (66%), and operating hours (64%).
- Easy and convenient registration process (84%) and obtaining GEM account (87%) satisfied most.

### A Measure of Our Success .... 2007-2008 New Student Survey Results

Of the 876 new students responding to the 2007-2008 New Student Survey, 61% were female, 39% were male. Two-thirds (65%) were 19 years of age or younger. The majority (84%) were not married. Sixteen percent were with dependent children. Nearly one-half (48%) were first-generation students. Sixty percent were first-time freshman and 38% were transferred from elsewhere. Four in ten were likely to reside in residence halls during their first semester. Most (73%) depended on their parents, relatives, or friends as the primary source of their first year educational expenses, 44% rely on Pell Grants, 30% on Federal direct loans, and 47% on other scholarships.

### Their college choice

Factors that impacted their decision to attend college the most:

- To be able to get a better job (71%)
- To be able to earn more money (70%)
- To learn about things of interest to them (70%)
- To gain a general education and appreciation of ideas (65%)
- To prepare for graduate or professional school (55%)
- To obtain a bachelor's degree from JSU was the primary goal for nearly all (91%)

A majority indicated the availability of a particular program of study (major) (73%), JSU's academic reputation (61%), the availability of financial aid or scholarship (53%), and cost of tuition and fees (51%) were very important reasons in their decision to attend JSU.

Most learned about JSU through the JSU Web site (57%), from their parents or relatives (44%), and their campus visits (39%).

### **Expectations**

Nursing was the most popular choice of major (18%), followed by Elementary Education (7%) and Criminal Justice (6%).

Most reported that they would have a very good chance to earn a bachelor's degree at JSU (75%), and find a good job after college in the field for which they were trained (68%).





The campaign, entitled "The Power of 125...Join the Celebration" has been a comprehensive fundraising effort designed to support all five colleges of the university, scholarships, and athletics. After reaching the initial goal of \$17.5 million early in the campaign, a new goal of \$25 million was established. The campaign office is proud to acknowledge that the new goal has been surpassed. As of November 2008 over \$28 million has been raised from our alumni, friends, federal, state and local funding sources. This total includes both planned gifts and gifts-in-kind. The JSU Foundation has receipted over 59,000 gifts during the campaign.










#### First-Time Freshmen by Full-Time / Part-Time Status














## Fall 2008 Alabama Students By County


