# AGRICULTURE LIBRARY RESEARCH GUIDE

## **INTRODUCTION**

Agriculture as a science in the United States dates back to the late nineteenth century with the creation of the agricultural experiment stations and the formation of the land-grant college. It encompasses not only the basic production of food, but also food safety; natural resources and environment; rural development; food, nutrition, and consumer services, foreign agricultural services; and marketing and regulatory. In Houston Cole Library most print sources (such as books, periodicals) related to agriculture are located on 10<sup>th</sup> floor. Electronic sources (such as databases) can be accessed via computer stations on each floor.

#### **PRINT SOURCES**

Books and print journals are the main pint sources in the HCL providing a foundation for research. Books and journal articles may also contain useful bibliographies which may lead to additional sources of research. When looking for print materials, consult the Library of Congress Subject Headings to select the proper term(s) to use as subjects under "Library Catalog" (<a href="http://library.jsu.edu/">http://library.jsu.edu/</a>). Some possible subject headings can be: Agriculture, Agriculture Alabama History, Agriculture and state, Agriculture environmental aspect, and etc. "Keyword Anywhere" & "Title" searches can also be conducted under the "Library Catalog".
