

## LEADING EDGE INSTITUTE

The Leading Edge Institute is a unique leadership development process for young women across the state of Alabama. It is an interactive, educational process that brings together college women to provide them with leadership skill development, expose them to critical issues facing Alabama, and connect them with experienced leaders. More than 30 leaders--from corporate executives and scholars to community activists and political officials--volunteer to serve as faculty and mentors. Each year, Jacksonville State University selects three distinguished women to represent the university at the Leading Edge Institute.

### **There are Four Major Components to the Process:**

- 1 Summer Institute-** An intensive, week-long program that takes place at the 4-H Youth Center in Columbiana, Alabama, and concludes with a trip to Alabama's Black Belt to experience some challenges facing communities and some of the most innovative solutions. Students work together on a service project during the week and interact with dynamic leaders.
- 2 Leadership Action Opportunities-** A mini-grant program provides students with resources to take on a community challenge and work in teams to make a difference. Other opportunities include shadowing women leaders, developing mentoring relationships and continuing learning opportunities for alumnae.
- 3 Fall Connections/ Alumnae Workshop-** This is a partial weekend workshop connecting LEI students from across campuses and classes for skill, project, and state issue development. During the weekend, they have the opportunity to join in an outdoor recreational learning experience that challenges students in risk-taking, teamwork and reflection.
- 4 Winter Summit-** The weekend begins with a special dinner honoring the current class' participants. The Summit includes a guided reflection and evaluation process for the students' projects as they present their experiences to each other. A group dynamic/power simulation game, a panel on women in politics and personal development planning complete the curriculum.
