University Travel and Self-Improvement Grants

A call for University Travel and Self-Improvement Grants was posted this week. Please encourage eligible faculty to apply for these grants. To give the Dean's staff time to database the grants and to allow Dr. Wade time to review and sign, we need the original grant applications in the Associate Dean's office, 107 Martin Hall, by **Monday, October 8**. We will make the additional seven copies of each grant requested by Dr. Delap and will deliver the completed packets to his office by the University deadline. **Please note that the College deadline is earlier than the University deadline.**

Here are some highlights to remember as you review and sign your faculty members' applications:

1. Only full-time, regular faculty holding the rank of assistant professor, associate professor, or professor are eligible for this funding.
2. Evaluation criteria include: (a) faculty tenure and/or promotion status - faculty working toward tenure and/or promotion will be given top priority; (b) conference type - national and international conferences will be considered over regional conferences; (c) presentation type - presentations, including posters, will take precedence over panel membership, officer involvement, or other conference duties; (d) strength of the application - justification and explanation of the contribution to the field (discipline), authorship ranking, presentation topic, originality, and other merits of the application.
3. Documentation of acceptance or official participation must be included. This can be a letter, email, or program page. The committee will not fund the application if no documentation is included. The Department Head should check for documentation prior to sending the application to the Associate Dean.
4. Documentation of the registration costs for the conference must also be included.
5. The guidelines and necessary form are available at http://www.jsu.edu/academicaffairs/travel_grant.html. This page has all the information on the grants, plus a link to the Adobe application into which the faculty can enter data.
