Repairs to Library Roof

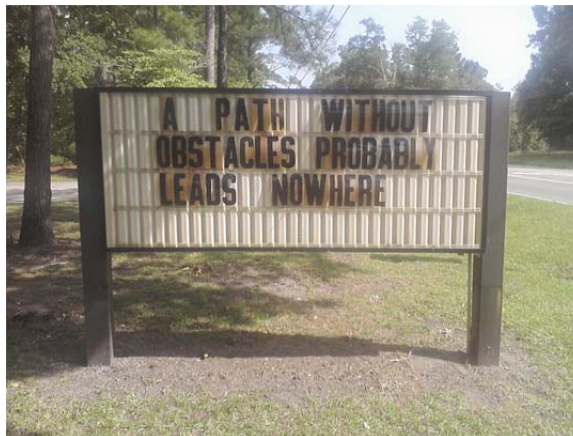
