A non-resident student may apply for reclassification of residency by completing this form and including photocopies of relevant documents for each item checked. This completed form and documents must be submitted as a complete package to the Registrar's Office, 113 Bibb Graves Hall. The completed package which must include this form and all supporting documents must be received on or prior to the end of drop/add period of the semester or term for which a request for in state tuition is being sought. For all summer terms, the deadline is the first class day of the first summer part-of-term registered.

Check all appropriate items (minimum of **three** required*) and enclose photocopies of supporting documents for each item checked. Examples of supporting documents are suggested after each criterion.

- ____ 1. Ownership of a residence or other real property in the state, or designated Georgia county, and payment of state ad valorem taxes on residence or property (proof of ad valorem taxes).
- ____ 2. Possession of state or local licenses to do business or practice a profession in the state or designated Georgia county (proof of license).
- ____ 3. Ownership of personal property in the state, payment of state taxes on the property, and possession of state license plates or designated Georgia county (tax receipt).

- ____4. Payment of Alabama, or designated Georgia county, state income taxes as a resident (tax forms or pay record).
- ____5. Full-time employment in the state or designated Georgia county (original of letter from employer on company letterhead or similar document).
- ____6. Graduation from an Alabama or designated Georgia county high school or GED taken in Alabama or designated Georgia county (official transcript or test score report).
- ____7. Previous periods of residency in the state, or designated Georgia county, continuing for one year or more (evidence of address with student's identity reflected).
- ____8. Residence in the state, or designated Georgia county, or a spouse, parents or children (evidence of address and relationship required).
- ____9. Voter registration and voting in the state, or designated Georgia county, more significantly, continuing voter registration in the state that initially occurred at least one year prior to the initial registration of the student in Alabama at a public institution of higher education (evidence of voter registration required).
- ____10. Continuous physical presence in the state, or designated Georgia county, for a purpose other than attending school, except for temporary absences for travel, military service, and temporary employment.
- ____11. Membership in religious, professional business, civic, or social organization in the state or designated Georgia county (membership documentation (certificate, roster, directory, etc.)).
- ____12. Maintenance in the state, or designated Georgia county, of checking AND savings accounts, safe deposit boxes, or investment accounts (bank record showing history of account maintenance).
- ____13. In-state, or designated Georgia county, address shown on selective service registration, driver's license, automobile title registration, hunting AND fishing license, insurance policies, stock and bond registration, last will and testament, annuities, or retirement plans (license or registration).

International Students must have the ability to remain indefinitely in the United States and otherwise meet the requirements of the Alabama law.

- A person must be a Permanent Resident Alien, Political Asylee, Political Refugee, or who hold an A, E, G, H, I, L, O, P, R, TC, TD, or TN visa to be considered as an in-state resident or one for tuition purposes.
- Students who hold a B, F, J or M visa are not eligible to establish Alabama residency unless their supporting person meets the criteria in this policy for residency for tuition purposes. Full-time employees of a company party to an Alabama Free Trade Agreement may be eligible to establish residency based on the employment.
