**Dr. Tracey Matthews,**College of Health Professions and Wellness

Dr. Matthews received her BS in Sports Biomechanics at the University of Connecticut and her Master's and Doctorate in Physical Education with a concentration in Research and Statistics at Springfield College in Springfield, MA. It was during this time that she realized she wanted to pursue a career in higher education. In 1997, Matthews began working at Castleton University in Vermont as an assistant professor and was honored with the Outstanding First-Year Faculty Award. In 2000, she became Chairperson of the Physical Education department. In 2002, she returned to Springfield College as an assistant professor of research and statistics. While at Springfield College she served as Department Chair and Dean. In January 2020, Matthews was appointed as Dean of the College of Health Professions and Wellness and responsible for overseeing Nursing, Kinesiology, and Respiratory Therapy programs. Her most favorite part of her job is working with students and faculty!



Professionally, Dr. Matthews served as a member of the American College of Sports Medicine ActivEarth Taskforce, in Chair roles for a Measurement and Evaluation Council, and Editorial Board of the Measurement and Evaluation in Physical Education and Exercise Science Journal. She received the honor award from the Measurement and Evaluation Council in 2012. She has presented internationally, nationally, and regionally on topics including assessment, measurement, and Interprofessional Education. She has also served as the statistical and research contributor to over 60 publications in exercise science and physical education. The textbook she co-authored, Designing and Conducting Research in Health and Human Performance is utilized in undergraduate curricula related to Kinesiology and Physical Education, and is in its second edition.

Dean Matthews resides in Oxford, AL with her husband Lee, and toy poodle, Doby (their most favorite elf). They are members of the Calhoun County Rotary Club in which they participate in a variety of communityservice activities.
