## DR. MAKENZIE BAYLES

Dr. Makenzie Bayles received her Ph.D. in Behavioral Psychology from the University of Kansas in 2013 and her M.S. from Jacksonville State University (JSU) in 2009. Dr. Bayles is currently an Associate Professor of Psychology at JSU and the Graduate Program Coordinator for JSU's M.S. in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) program. Her research interests include behavior-analytic strategies for facilitating development and enhancing early childhood education, the assessment and treatment of problem behavior, the use of generalized conditioned reinforcers, and, more recently, the of behavioral principles and application techniques to older adults and age-related problems. Dr. Bayles is an active member of the Association for Behavior Analysis International (ABAI) and the Alabama Association for Behavior Analysis (ALABA). She is a Board Certified and Licensed Behavior Analyst.

Dr. Bayles loves training the next generation of Board Certified Behavior Analysts in JSU's ABA program. Her graduate students have gone on to hold top positions throughout the state such as clinical directors, school consultants, owners of behavioral clinics, and university faculty. In addition to teaching her students clinical skills, Dr. Bayles ensures her students receive training on the critical research skills needed to understand and deliver evidence-based treatments. Two of her recent graduates, Megan Ford and Laura Senn, went on to publish their master's thesis research in top-tier behavioral journals.

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
