University Honors (UH) Catalog Descriptions

UH 101 Honors Lecture (1)

This course is an open forum for the discussion of ideas and submission of reflective papers and/or service-learning projects. The topic of the course will vary each semester (service learning, education reform, poverty, tax reform, etc.). May be repeated for a total of two credit hours. Pass/Fail.

UH 201 Honors Forum (1)

Students attend selected campus events, followed by discussion and a reflection paper. Attendance is required at 3-5 events, as approved by Honors Program. May be repeated with permission from the Honors Program.

UH 202 Honors Book Club (1)

Students enrolled in this course will perform assigned readings and actively participate in class discussions. May be repeated for a total of two credit hours. Pass/Fail.

UH 205 Honors Professional Preparation Seminar (1)

Students enrolled in this course will be required to participate in discussions and complete work on seminar-style presentations on subjects related to their major or future career goals. They may be asked to attend a minimum number of campus events (pre-approved by Honors) including interactions with representatives from professional programs or prospective employers. Students will submit structured reflection on these experiences. May be repeated for credit once with permission from the Honors Program.

UH 300 Honors Special Topics: Interdisciplinary (1)

The topic will vary and appeal to students from various disciplines. This course will provide upper-level Honors students the opportunity to draw on their educational experience and utilize their critical thinking skills in an interdisciplinary manner. May be repeated for a total of two credit hours. Students may not repeat the same course topic or theme. Letter grade.
