FIDC 2 - Coaching Red Dot Sights on Pistols

This course is designed to improve a firearms instructor's ability to coach new and veteran shooters in the use and implementation of a Red Dot Sight on a pistol.

Course topics include:

- Acquiring the dot through presentation
- Reacquiring the dot from recoil and reloads
- Slide manipulations with a pistol RDS
- Transitioning from iron sights to an RDS
- Off-hand shooting an RDS
- Awkward shooting positions with an RDS
- Target transitions with an RDS
- Equipment & Feature considerations
- RDS failure and other Duty-use considerations
- Shooting on the move with an RDS

Requirements & Equipment

All students must be either FBI, NRA, or FLETC Certified Firearms Instructors

You are not required to attend FIDC-1 prior to attending this course.

STUDENT EQUIPMENT

- Duty Pistol with a slide-mounted Red Dot Sight ****SEE NOTE BELOW ABOUT CLASS GUNS**
- Magazines (minimum 4)
- Duty Gear
 - o Duty Holster & Magazine Pouches. NO floppy unsecured holsters.
- 800 pistol rounds (9mm if using a class gun)
- Slow motion video app on cell phone (Coach's Eye is free in the app store)
- Eye Protection
- Hearing Protection
- Cap with bill
- Sunscreen, Drinks, Snacks, etc.

- **CLASS GUNS:** Class guns, magazines, holsters and magazine pouches will be available for any student who needs or wants to use them. ALL CLASS GUNS ARE 9mm! You must bring 9mm Ammo to use a class gun. Class guns are Glocks (primarily with a Trijicon RMR Type 2).
