Parents of Future Gamecocks

The Spring is a wonderful time for students to complete their next steps after admission and confirm their plans to enroll at JSU. Completing the steps below will help to ensure your student is prepared and ready to begin classes at JSU this fall.

Next Steps:

Gamecock Orientation (GO!) registration is live!

All first-time freshmen under the age of 25 are required to attend GO! and it is strongly encouraged for first time transfer students. We encourage students to register by May 1st to secure their spot and confirm their enrollment! You can register by visiting jsu.edu/go/register.

GO! is a one-day program designed to help students with the transition to college. During GO! students will meet other students, learn from faculty/staff, meet with an academic advisor, and register for classes.

We highly encourage students to submit their FAFSA! The FAFSA is the only way for JSU to determine if a student qualifies for federal grants or loans. The maximum Federal Pell Grant has increased to \$7,395 annually. JSU also uses information from the FAFSA to identify students who may qualify for JSU funded grants, like the Gamecock Enhancement Grant, and state funded grants. Don't let your students miss out on funding for their college education!


Parents of Current Gamecocks

Academic Support/Student Success Center Services

Academic Support/Tutoring Services is located on the 2nd floor of the Houston Cole Library. Their summer tutoring hours are 10a-4p Monday-Thursday and 10a-2p on Friday. Appointments can be scheduled using JSU Navigate, found in your MyJSU account, or by using the Navigate Student app. (Please checkin at the front desk with your student ID when you arrive.)

Tutor.com is also available to all JSU students and can be accessed through your Canvas courses. Tutor.com is available 24/7 and is completely free!

Success Coaching is available by appointment. If you are interested in meeting with your success coach, you can schedule an appointment using JSU Navigate.

Study tips for students as they move towards the end of the semester:

- 1. Use your notes to create flashcards, outlines, study guides, and to predict exam questions.
- 2. Review your notes, PowerPoints, study guides, etc. each day.
- 3. Recite and restate information to enhance your memory skills.
- 4. Get a tutor if you need one or utilize Tutor.com.
- 5. Create a study group or use the Study Buddies feature in the Navigate Student app.
- 6. Organize your time and take breaks as needed.
- 7. Meet with your success coach on a regular basis.
- 8. Create a comfortable and distraction-free study environment.
- 9. Know your final exam schedule in advance so that you can set aside study times for specific courses.
- 10. Utilize the Student Success Center if you need a place to study.

Financial Aid/Scholarships

- Your student must maintain an institutional GPA of at least 2.0 and earn 66.7% (2/3) of all credit hours attempted to maintain their financial aid eligibility.
- Your student may be eligible for financial aid this summer! In order to receive aid in the summer semester, your student must be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours.
- Additionally, your student must earn 24 hours to have their merit scholarship renewed at the end of each academic year.

Spring 2023 Move Out Information

Residence halls and apartments will close on Sunday, April 30, 12:00 p.m. Students must vacate their assignment by the appropriate date unless they have a summer assignment in Sparkman Hall (or on-campus apartments) or are approved to stay due to athletics still competing. They will need to be approved to stay by their Residence Life Coordinator. See summer information below for more details.

Summer 2023 Information

Sparkman Hall will be available for summer housing for the summer 2023 terms. Residents are not required to be enrolled in summer classes to live in Sparkman Hall for the summer.

Option #1: I currently live in an on-campus apartment (Campus Inn One Bedroom, Campus Inn Efficiency, College, Colonial Arms, Jax, Mountain Street/Goodlett Avenue Apartments, Pannell, or Penn House). The Apartment Areas will remain open for summer 2023. If you live in one of the communities listed above, you will be able to remain in your assignment for the full summer term. The following requirements must be met to remain in your apartment for the summer 2023 term.

- Squat or reselect your exact same assignment.
- Submit a Summer Housing Application.
- The cost for summer is the same rate as the spring rate. Example, if you live in Pannell, you will be billed \$2650 for the summer term.
- You must be preregistered for fall 2023 by May 1, 2023, or your assignment will be voided. **Residents that are graduating in summer 2023 may request approval to stay.*
- However, you may relocate to Sparkman Hall for summer housing. If you choose to relocate to Sparkman Hall, you will be charged the summer rate(s), which are listed below. Classes are not required to live at Sparkman Hall for the summer terms.

Option #2: I live in any remaining on-campus facility (Crow, Curtiss, Daugette,

Dixon, Fitzpatrick, International House, Leadership House for Women, Kappa Sigma, Logan, Long Leaf, Meehan, Patterson, Pi Kappa Phi, Salls, or Sparkman) and want to live in summer housing.

- Sparkman Hall will be available for summer housing.
- Residents are not required to be enrolled in summer classes to live in Sparkman Hall for the summer. You will be billed for the length of stay as indicated on your summer housing application. Example, if you selected Summer I on your application, you will only be able to reside in Sparkman Hall for the Summer I term.
- The rates for summer housing are Summer I (May 16 June 22)
 \$850, Summer 4 Week Term (June 1 June 29) \$570, Summer II (June 26 August 1) \$850, Full Summer (May 16 August 1) \$1700.
- Residents will need to select the appropriate applications for the summer classes for which they are enrolled or plan to stay. For example, if you are only taking Summer I classes, you would need to submit the Summer Housing Application and indicate your specific term(s) online through <u>THD Self Service</u>.
