# **Important Dates**

- The Competitive Scholarship Application (<u>JAXAPP</u>) opened September 1 for 2024-2025. The deadline to apply is February 1, 2024.

- Midterm grades will post on October 5 after 10 a.m. so that students may check their progress. Spring 2024 and Fall 2024/Spring 2025 applications for students who do <u>NOT</u> currently live on campus will open on October 10. More information is available on our <u>website</u>.

NOTE: Current residents will reapply for housing beginning February 1. More information will be available in December.

## Thanksgiving Break is around the corner!

Residence halls will close for Thanksgiving holidays. Residents are required to vacate their rooms during hall closings by the specified date and time that will be posted in the residence halls, unless they have an approved Break Housing Request on file. Continuous housing residents (i.e., Meehan Hall, Sparkman Hall, on-campus apartments, and The Pointe @ JSU) may remain in their assignment during all breaks and holidays. Residents staying for Thanksgiving Break will be required to submit a Break Housing Request online beginning November 1. During Thanksgiving holidays, residents may leave their personal belongings in their rooms. However, the Office of Housing Operations and Residence Life is not responsible for theft or damage to personal belongings.

Residence Halls close for Thanksgiving Holidays on November 19, 2023, at 12:00 p.m. Residence Halls reopen after Thanksgiving Break on November 26, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.
