Major Cory Roberts commissioned as an Infantry Officer in April 2002 through US Army Officer Candidate School at Fort Benning, GA following eight years of enlisted service as an Infantryman. MAJ Roberts later graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Baccalaureate Degree in Criminal Justice from Columbus State University in Columbus, GA. MAJ Roberts continued his education by receiving his Master's in Leadership and Management from Webster University in St. Louis, MO and graduating from the US Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, KS. During his 23yrs of Military Service, MAJ Roberts has served in leadership positions from the Platoon through the Battalion and Squadron level. Most recently, he was the Operations Officer for the US Army's Joint

Rote Updates

The program currently has 70 cadets. We have just completed our Record APFT for the fall semester. All cadets made marked improvement over their September APFT. The spring semester will focus on functional fitness, improved APFT test scores, and introduction to the new Army Combat Readiness 6 Event PT test, which will become the standard in October 2018. Our Ranger Challenge team placed 8th in the State Competition held at Oak Mountain in October. The Cadets performed well at the Fall FTX on Pelham Range in mid-October. They executed tactical tasks and land navigation following an ALNG supported Helicopter insertion to the training area.

With the recently improved curriculum, military science courseware is more battle focused and designed to educate cadets to pass the Advanced Camp requirements. We are including a common thread linkage in the delivery of lessons to integrate the Maneuver School's "Expanded Troop Leading Procedures" into all aspects of Gamecock Battalion Training and Education. Although most of our cadets will not be maneuverists, it is my belief that the more they understand how to think, speak, and perform like a maneuverist, the more successful they will be as they progress in their career.

The ROTC department is receiving superb support from the JSU Administration. We have recently received and installed an ice machine and the mechanical engineering department completed repairs to the rappel tower. Following load test and certification, the tower will reopen for training. Administrators are looking to Modernization Command Training and Evaluation Division at Fort Bliss, TX where his team focused on developing systems and tactics for the Army 2025 and beyond concepts.

Some of MAJ Roberts' assignments include: 4th Infantry Division, 2nd Infantry Division, 3rd Infantry Division, 101st Airborne Division, 1st Infantry Division, and the 1st Cavalry Division. MAJ Roberts also served at an instructor at the US Army Engineer Captain's Career Course, curriculum and faculty development at the School of Advanced Leadership and Tactics, and Operations for the Joint Modernization Command. He has had 3 combat rotations to Operation Iraqi Freedom and multiple operational assignments to Kuwait, Kosovo, and Korea.

MAJ Roberts' award and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2nd Oak Leaf Cluster), ARCOM (8th Oak Leaf Cluster), and Army Achievement Medal (6th Oak Leaf Cluster). MAJ Roberts also earned the Combat Infantryman's Badge, Expert Infantry Badge, Ranger Tab, Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, and the Pathfinder Badge.

MAJ Roberts is married to Captain (Retired) Kaycee Roberts. He has three children: Payton, Logan, and Cayden.
